

Our hope is that this guide will inspire families to come together, be the hands and feet of Christ, and experience the true joy of giving this holiday season!



# Cocoa & Mug Gift

Use a small gift to help break the ice and build relationships within your community! This simple gesture can extend encouragement, friendship and hope this Christmas season.



#### WHAT YOU'LL NEED

- A FESTIVE OR PERSONALIZED MUG
- HOT CHOCOLATE POWDER
- MINI MARSHMALLOWS
- SMALL PAPER TAG

- RIBBON
- CELLOPHANE BAGS
- OPTIONAL: CANDY CANES

#### **DIRECTIONS**

#### **♦ STEP 1:** PREPARE YOUR HOT CHOCOLATE MIX

Fill a small cellophane bag with hot chocolate powder and fill another one with the marshmallows. This keeps the chocolate powder from "muddying" the marshmallows. You could also use a small ready-made packet of hot chocolate instead if you prefer.

#### **♦ STEP 2: FILL YOUR MUG**

Place the bag of hot chocolate at the bottom of your mug and add the bag of marshmallows on top.



Optional: Add any other ingredients to the mug, such as chocolate sprinkles or chocolate chips. Keep these in separate bags as well.

#### **♦ STEP 3: WRAP AND DECORATE YOUR MUG**

Place your mug inside a medium-sized cellophane bag and tie the top of it shut with a twist tie.

Take the small paper tag and write a short & thoughtful message. Some examples could be:

"Warm wishes and sweet sips for Christmas!"

"Cozy up with a cup of Christmas cheer!"

"Hot cocoa, a mug, and a hug in a cup!"

"Sending you warmth and joy this Christmas!"

"May your Christmas be merry and your cocoa extra chocolatey!"

"Sweet moments and warm sips - just for you!"

"A little treat to warm your hands and heart this Christmas!"


"Here's to a cozy and sweet Christmas season!"

Next, measure and trim a piece of ribbon and grab two candy canes.

Begin to tie the ribbon around the top of the cellophane bag, but don't finish with a bow just yet. Hold your candy canes in a cross shape where your bow will be and then secure them in place with the bow.

# DIY SPICE & HERB FIRE STARTER

Making fragrant spice and herb fire starters is a great family project that not only fills the home with the cozy scent of the holidays but also creates beautiful, functional gifts for others. These fire starters are perfect for fireplaces or outdoor fire pits and add a festive aroma when burned.



#### SUPPLIES NEEDED

- **PINECONES:** Collect pinecones from your yard or purchase them from a craft store.
- DRIED HERBS AND SPICES Common holiday scents:

Cinnamon sticks
 Dried orange peels

Star aniseWhole clovesLavender

RosemarySage

- WAX (BEESWAX OR SOY WAX): You'll need wax to coat the pinecones and help the herbs and spices stick.
- **ESSENTIAL OILS** (OPTIONAL): Add holidayscented essential oils like cinnamon, clove, or fir to enhance the fragrance.
- TWINE OR COTTON WICK: To wrap around the fire starter for easy lighting.
- DOUBLE BOILER OR OLD TIN CAN: For melting the wax safely. Use an old tin can placed inside a pot of boiling water if you don't have a double boiler.
- BAKING SHEET AND PARCHMENT PAPER: For letting the fire starters dry.
- TONGS: To safely dip and remove the pinecones from the melted wax.
- GLOVES (OPTIONAL): For handling the hot waxed pinecones if necessary.
- **DECORATIVE RIBBON OR TAGS** (OPTIONAL): To decorate if you're gifting the fire starters.



#### **INSTRUCTIONS**

#### **♦ STEP 1: PREPARE YOUR WORKSPACE**

 Line a baking sheet with parchment paper for easy cleanup and prepare your double boiler for melting the wax. Make sure the area is well-ventilated if using essential oils.

#### **♦ STEP 2:** MELT THE WAX

 Heat the wax in a double boiler or tin can submerged in simmering water. Once the wax is fully melted, you can stir in a few drops of essential oils for added scent (optional).

#### **♦ STEP 3:** PREPARE THE PINECONES

 Attach a piece of twine or a cotton wick to the base of each pinecone, leaving a few inches free so it can easily be lit later.

#### **♦ STEP 4:** DIP THE PINECONES IN WAX

Using tongs, dip each pinecone into the melted wax, making sure it is well-coated. You can dip them twice for a thicker wax layer if desired. After dipping, place them on the parchment-lined baking sheet to cool slightly.

#### **♦ STEP 5:** ADD HERBS AND SPICES

 While the wax is still soft, press dried herbs and spices into the pinecone. Arrange cinnamon sticks, star anise, cloves, or any other fragrant items in the crevices of the pinecone. These will burn and release a beautiful aroma when the fire starter is used.



#### **♦ STEP 6:** LET THEM DRY

 Allow the pinecones to dry completely. Once dry, they'll be solid and ready to use.

#### **♦ STEP 7:** DECORATE AND PACKAGE (OPTIONAL)

O If giving the fire starters as gifts, you can tie festive ribbons around them or attach small gift tags with instructions. The tag might say: "Light the twine and enjoy the warmth and scent of the season!".

#### **♦ STEP 8:** HOW TO USE

• To use the fire starters, place one in your fireplace or fire pit, light the twine or wick, and let the pinecone and herbs catch fire, helping to ignite larger logs.

These fire starters are a beautiful, aromatic addition to holiday fires and can be packaged as thoughtful, homemade gifts. Perfect for cozy Christmas evenings!



# KOURABIEDES

# Greek Butter Almond Cookies

**Kourabiedes** are traditional Greek shortbread cookies, often made during the Christmas season. These buttery, crumbly cookies are flavored with almonds and coated generously in powdered sugar, making them melt-in-your-mouth delicious!



#### **INGREDIENTS**

- 1 CUP (2 STICKS) UNSALTED BUTTER, SOFTENED
- 1/2 CUP POWDERED SUGAR
- 1 TEASPOON VANILLA EXTRACT
- 1 EGG YOLK (OPTIONAL, FOR RICHNESS)
- 2 CUPS ALL-PURPOSE FLOUR
- 1/2 TEASPOON BAKING POWDER
- 1/4 TEASPOON SALT
- 1/2 CUP FINELY CHOPPED TOASTED ALMONDS
- 1/4 TEASPOON GROUND CLOVES (OPTIONAL, FOR ADDED FLAVOR)
- 2 CUPS POWDERED SUGAR (FOR DUSTING)

#### **INSTRUCTIONS**

#### **♦ STEP 1: PREPARE THE DOUGH**

#### Preheat the Oven:

O Preheat your oven to 350°F (175°C). Line a baking sheet with parchment paper.

#### Cream the Butter and Sugar:

 In a large mixing bowl, beat the softened butter and 1/2 cup powdered sugar together using an electric mixer on medium speed until light and fluffy, about 3-5 minutes.

#### Add Vanilla and Egg Yolk:

O Beat in the vanilla extract and egg yolk (if using) until well combined.

#### Mix in the Dry Ingredients:

- O In a separate bowl, whisk together the flour, baking powder, salt, and ground cloves (if using).
- Gradually add the dry ingredients to the butter mixture, mixing just until incorporated.



#### Fold in the Almonds:

 Stir in the finely chopped toasted almonds. The dough should be soft but not sticky. If it's too sticky, chill the dough for 10-15 minutes in the fridge.

#### **♦ STEP 2:** SHAPE THE COOKIES

#### Form the Cookies:

O Roll small pieces of dough (about 1 tablespoon) into balls or crescent shapes and place them on the prepared baking sheet about 1 inch apart.

#### **♦ STEP 3:** BAKE THE COOKIES

#### Bake:

O Bake the cookies in the preheated oven for 15-20 minutes, or until they are lightly golden around the edges.

#### Cool Slightly:

 Remove the cookies from the oven and let them cool on the baking sheet for 5 minutes, then transfer them to a wire rack to cool completely.

#### **♦ STEP 4:** COAT IN POWDERED SUGAR

#### Powder the Cookies

 Once the cookies are completely cool, generously sift powdered sugar over them to coat. You can also gently roll each cookie in powdered sugar for a thick, snowy layer.

#### **SERVING SUGGESTIONS:**

- O Serve these cookies with a warm cup of coffee or tea.
- For added flavor, dust the cookies with more powdered sugar just before serving.

# BAKED CINNAMON ORNAMENTS

These **Baked Cinnamon Ornaments** are a fun and festive project for the holiday season! They make great decorations and gifts, and they fill your home with a delightful cinnamon scent. Enjoy crafting and sharing them with family and friends!



### SUPPLIES NEEDED

### **INGREDIENTS:**

- 1 CUP GROUND CINNAMON
- 1 CUP APPLESAUCE
- 1 TABLESPOON WHITE GLUE (OPTIONAL, FOR DURABILITY)
- 1 TEASPOON GROUND CLOVES (OPTIONAL, FOR ADDED FRAGRANCE)
- 1 TEASPOON GROUND NUTMEG
   (OPTIONAL, FOR ADDED FRAGRANCE)

### TOOLS:

- MIXING BOWL
- SPOON OR SPATULA
- ROLLING PIN
- BAKING SHEET
- PARCHMENT PAPER (OPTIONAL)
- COOKIE CUTTERS (VARIOUS SHAPES)
- STRAW OR TOOTHPICK (FOR MAKING HOLES)
- RIBBON OR TWINE (FOR HANGING)
- OVEN

### **INSTRUCTIONS**

### **♦ STEP 1: PREPARE THE DOUGH**

### Mix the Ingredients:

- In a mixing bowl, combine the ground cinnamon, applesauce, and, if using, white glue. Add ground cloves and nutmeg for extra fragrance if desired.
- O Mix until a dough forms. It should be pliable and not too sticky. If it's too wet, add a bit more cinnamon; if it's too dry, add a little more applesauce.

### **♦ STEP 2:** ROLL OUT THE DOUGH

### Roll Out the Dough:

- O Lightly dust your work surface with ground cinnamon to prevent sticking.
- O Roll out the dough to about 1/4 inch thick using a rolling pin.

### **♦ STEP 3:** CUT SHAPES

### **Cut the Ornaments:**

- Use cookie cutters to cut out shapes from the rolled dough. Place the shapes on a baking sheet lined with parchment paper.
- Use a straw or toothpick to make a small hole at the top of each ornament for hanging.

### **♦ STEP 4:** BAKE THE ORNAMENTS

### Bake:

- O Preheat your oven to 200°F (93°C).
- Place the baking sheet in the oven and bake the ornaments for about 2-3 hours. This low temperature will dry them out without burning. Turn them over halfway through for even drying.

### Cool:

Once baked, allow the ornaments to cool completely on a wire rack.

### **♦ STEP 5: FINISH AND DECORATE**

### Add Ribbon:

• After the ornaments are cool, thread a ribbon or twine through the holes and tie a knot for hanging.

### Decorate (Optional):

You can decorate the ornaments with paint, glitter, or markers if desired, though they are lovely as-is!

### **DISPLAY SUGGESTIONS:**

- O Hang the ornaments on your Christmas tree, in windows, or on garlands.
- O They can also be used as gift tags or decorative accents for wrapped presents.





Fun Facts from other Countries



### **ICELAND - THE 13 YULE LADS**

In Iceland, children are visited by 13 mischievous Yule Lads during the 13 days leading up to Christmas. Each night, kids leave shoes by the window, and depending on their behavior, they either receive gifts or rotten potatoes!



### JAPAN - KFC CHRISTMAS FEAST

In Japan, Christmas isn't traditionally celebrated, but it has become a custom for many families to enjoy a bucket of KFC on Christmas Day. This tradition began in the 1970s after a successful marketing campaign by the fast-food chain.



### **GERMANY - ADVENT CALENDARS AND ST. NICHOLAS DAY**

Advent calendars are a big deal in Germany, often including small gifts or treats behind each door. Also, on December 6th (St. Nicholas Day), children leave out their shoes for St. Nicholas to fill with sweets, fruit, and small toys.



### **PHILIPPINES - GIANT LANTERN FESTIVAL**

In the city of San Fernando, the Philippines, there's a stunning Christmas lantern festival called the **Ligligan Parul.** Gigantic, intricate lanterns are crafted and lit up in a vibrant display, symbolizing the Star of Bethlehem.





### **MEXICO - LAS POSADAS**

From December 16th to Christmas Eve, Mexicans participate in **Las Posadas**, a reenactment of Mary and Joseph's search for shelter. Communities go doorto-door, with songs and prayers, culminating in a celebration with food and piñatas.



### AUSTRALIA - BEACH BBQS

Since Christmas falls during the summer in Australia, it's common for Australians to celebrate with beach parties, BBQs, and outdoor festivities, rather than the typical wintery Christmas scenes seen in the Northern Hemisphere.



### **VENEZUELA - ROLLER SKATING TO CHURCH**

In Caracas, Venezuela, a unique tradition sees residents roller skate to early morning Christmas Mass. Roads are even closed to cars to accommodate the skaters!



### **SPAIN - EL GORDO LOTTERY**

Spain's Christmas season kicks off with **El Gordo**, the world's largest lottery draw, held on December 22nd. Many families and groups buy shares in tickets, hoping to win a slice of the massive jackpot.



### **UKRAINE - SPIDER WEB DECORATIONS**

In Ukraine, it's customary to decorate Christmas trees with fake spider webs. This tradition comes from a folk tale in which spiders spun webs over a poor family's tree, and on Christmas morning, the webs turned into gold and silver, bringing the family good fortune.

### **INGREDIENTS**

### **FOR THE SPONGE CAKE:**

- 4 LARGE EGGS, SEPARATED
- 1/2 CUP GRANULATED SUGAR, DIVIDED
- 1 TEASPOON VANILLA EXTRACT
- 1/3 CUP ALL-PURPOSE FLOUR
- 1/3 CUP COCOA POWDER (UNSWEETENED)
- 1/4 TEASPOON SALT
- POWDERED SUGAR (FOR DUSTING)

### FOR THE FILLING:

- 1 CUP HEAVY WHIPPING CREAM
- 1/4 CUP POWDERED SUGAR
- 1 TEASPOON VANILLA EXTRACT

### FOR THE CHOCOLATE GANACHE FROSTING:

- 1 CUP HEAVY CREAM
- 8 OZ SEMI-SWEET OR DARK CHOCOLATE, FINELY CHOPPED
- 1 TABLESPOON UNSALTED BUTTER (OPTIONAL, FOR A SHINY FINISH)

### FOR DECORATION (OPTIONAL):

- FRESH BERRIES, HOLLY SPRIGS, OR MERINGUE MUSHROOMS
- POWDERED SUGAR (TO RESEMBLE SNOW)

### **INSTRUCTIONS**

### **♦ STEP 1:** MAKE THE SPONGE CAKE

### Preheat the Oven:

O Preheat your oven to 350°F (175°C). Grease a 10x15-inch jelly roll pan, line it with parchment paper, and lightly grease the paper.

### Beat the Egg Yolks:

 In a large bowl, whisk together the egg yolks, 1/4 cup of sugar, and vanilla extract until pale and fluffy, about 3-4 minutes.

### Beat the Egg Whites:

 In a separate bowl, beat the egg whites on medium speed until soft peaks form. Gradually add the remaining 1/4 cup of sugar and continue beating until stiff peaks form.

### Combine the Egg Mixture:

• Gently fold the egg whites into the yolk mixture. Be careful not to deflate the egg whites too much.

### Add the Dry Ingredients:

 Sift together the flour, cocoa powder, and salt. Gently fold the dry ingredients into the egg mixture until just combined.



### Bake the Cake:

 Spread the batter evenly in the prepared jelly roll pan. Bake for 10-12 minutes or until the cake springs back when lightly touched.

### Roll the Cake:

• While the cake is still warm, dust a clean kitchen towel with powdered sugar. Carefully flip the cake onto the towel, remove the parchment paper, and gently roll the cake up with the towel (starting at a short end). Let it cool completely in the rolled shape.

### **♦ STEP 2: MAKE THE FILLING**

### Whip the Cream:

 In a bowl, whip the heavy cream, powdered sugar, and vanilla extract until stiff peaks form.

### Unroll the Cake:

 Once the cake has cooled, carefully unroll it and spread an even layer of whipped cream filling over the surface.

### Roll the Cake Again:

 Re-roll the cake, without the towel this time, into a log shape. Transfer it to a serving plate, seam side down.



### **♦ STEP 3:** MAKE THE CHOCOLATE GANACHE FROSTING

### Heat the Cream:

O In a small saucepan, heat the heavy cream over medium heat until it begins to simmer.

### Add the Chocolate:

Pour the hot cream over the chopped chocolate and let it sit for 2-3 minutes.
 Stir until the chocolate is fully melted and smooth. If desired, stir in 1 tablespoon of butter for extra shine.

### Let Ganache Thicken:

 Allow the ganache to cool for about 15-20 minutes, until it's thick but still spreadable.

### Frost the Cake:

• Spread the ganache over the rolled cake, covering it completely. Use a fork to create bark-like textures by dragging the tines along the surface of the ganache.

### **♦ STEP 4:** DECORATE

### Add Decorations:

O Decorate the Yule Log with fresh berries, sprigs of holly, or meringue mushrooms to resemble a woodland scene.


### **Dust with Snow:**

O Lightly dust the log with powdered sugar to resemble freshly fallen snow.

### **SERVING TIPS:**

- O Let the cake sit in the fridge for about 1 hour before serving for cleaner slices.
- Serve chilled or at room temperature, and enjoy a festive slice of this classic Christmas dessert!
