14 Therefore the Lord himself will give
you a sign. Behold, the virgin shall
conceive and bear a son, and shall call
his name **Immanuel**.



Isaiah 9: 6

6 For to us a child is born,
to us a son is given;
and the government shall be upon[a] his
shoulder,
and his name shall be called
Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God,
Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.



Matthew 1: 21-23

21 She will bear a son, and you shall call his name **Jesus**, for he will save his people from their sins.” 22 All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had spoken by the prophet:
23 “Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son,
and they shall call his name **Immanuel**”
(which means, God with us).



Jeremiah 33: 14-16

14 “Behold, the days are coming, declares the Lord, when I will fulfill the promise I made to the house of Israel and the house of Judah. 15 In those days and at that time I will cause a righteous Branch to spring up for David, and he shall execute justice and righteousness in the land. 16 In those days Judah will be saved, and Jerusalem will dwell securely. And this is the name by which it will be called: ‘The Lord is our righteousness.’



Luke 1: 30-33

30 And the angel said to her, “Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. 31 And behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall call his name **Jesus**. 32 He will be great and will be called the **Son of the Most High**. And the Lord God will give to him the throne of his father David, 33 and he will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end.”



Luke 2: 1-3

1 In those days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be registered. 2 This was the first registration when Quirinius was governor of Syria. 3 And all went to be registered, each to his own town.



Luke 2: 4-5

4 And Joseph also went up from Galilee, from the town of Nazareth, to Judea, to the city of David, which is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and lineage of David, 5 to be registered with Mary, his betrothed, who was **with child**.



Luke 2: 6-7

6 And while they were there, the time came for her to give birth. 7 And she gave birth to **her firstborn son** and wrapped him in swaddling cloths and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.



Luke 2: 8-12

8 And in the same region there were shepherds out in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night. 9 And an angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were filled with great fear. 10 And the angel said to them, “Fear not, for behold, I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. 11 For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is **Christ the Lord**. 12 And this will be a sign for you: you will find a baby wrapped in swaddling cloths and lying in a manger.”



Luke 2: 13-14

13 And suddenly there was with the
angel a multitude of the heavenly
host praising God and saying,
14 “Glory to God in the highest,
and on earth peace among those
with whom He is pleased!”



Luke 2: 15-16

15 When the angels went away from them into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, “Let us go over to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has made known to us.” 16 And they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and **the baby** lying in a manger.



Luke 2: 17-19

17 And when they saw it, they made known the saying that had been told them concerning this child. 18 And all who heard it wondered at what the shepherds told them. 19 But Mary treasured up all these things, pondering them in her heart.



Hebrews 1:6

6 And again, when he brings the **firstborn** into the world, he says, “Let all God’s angels worship **Him**.”



Matthew 2: 1-4

1 Now after **Jesus** was born in Bethlehem of Judea in the days of Herod the king, behold, wise men[a] from the east came to Jerusalem, 2 saying, “Where is he who has been born king of the Jews? For we saw His star when it rose and have come to worship Him.” 3 When Herod the king heard this, he was troubled, and all Jerusalem with him; 4 and assembling all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where **the Christ** was to be born.



Matthew 2: 5-6

5 They told him, “In Bethlehem of Judea,
for so it is written by the prophet:

6 “And you, O Bethlehem, in the land of
Judah,

are by no means least among the
rulers of Judah;

for from you shall come **a ruler**
who will **shepherd** my people Israel.”



Micah 5: 2-4

2 But you, O Bethlehem Ephrathah, who are too little to be among the clans of Judah, from you shall come forth for me one who is to be ruler in Israel, whose coming forth is from of old, from ancient days. 3

Therefore he shall give them up until the time when she who is in labor has given birth; then the rest of his brothers shall return to the people of Israel. 4 And he shall stand and shepherd his flock in the strength of the Lord in the majesty of the name of the Lord his God. And they shall dwell secure, for now **he shall be great to the ends of the earth.**



Matthew 2: 7-10

7 Then Herod summoned the wise men secretly and ascertained from them what time the star had appeared. 8 And he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, “Go and search diligently for **the child**, and when you have found him, bring me word, that I too may come and worship him.” 9 After listening to the king, they went on their way. And behold, the star that they had seen when it rose went before them until it came to rest over the place where **the child** was. 10 When they saw the star, they rejoiced exceedingly with great joy.



Matthew 2: 11-12

11 And going into the house, they saw **the child** with Mary his mother, and they fell down and worshiped him. Then, opening their treasures, they offered him gifts, gold and frankincense and myrrh.

12 And being warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they departed to their own country by another way.



Matthew 2: 19-23

19 But when Herod died, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared in a dream to Joseph in Egypt, 20 saying, “Rise, take **the child** and his mother and go to the land of Israel, for those who sought the child's life are dead.” 21 And he rose and took **the child** and his mother and went to the land of Israel. 22 But when he heard that Archelaus was reigning over Judea in place of his father Herod, he was afraid to go there, and being warned in a dream he withdrew to the district of Galilee. 23 And he went and lived in a city called Nazareth, so that what was spoken by the prophets might be fulfilled, **that he would be called a Nazarene.**



Isaiah 11: 1-2

1 There shall come forth a shoot from the stump
of Jesse,
and a branch from his roots shall bear fruit.
2 And the Spirit of the Lord shall rest upon him,
the Spirit of wisdom and understanding,
the Spirit of counsel and might,
the Spirit of knowledge and the fear of the
Lord.



John 1:29

29 The next day he saw **Jesus** coming toward him, and said, "Behold, **the Lamb of God**, who takes away the sin of the world!"



John 3: 16-17

16 “For God so loved the world,[i]
that he gave his **only Son**, that
whoever believes in him should not
perish but have eternal life. 17 For
God did not send **his Son** into the
world to condemn the world, but in
order that the world might be saved
through Him.
