



GAME INSTRUCTIONS

EB-Opoly was designed to promote the Eliza Broadus Offering (EBO) in churches in a creative and fun way. Not only is it fun, but it will educate your church members of the importance of their gifts to the Eliza Broadus Offering.

The twist to this game is that instead of collecting properties and earning money, each player's ultimate goal is to give away all of their money to EBO supported ministries.

Items needed:

Large dice

Playing tokens (choose items that a ministry would use such as deodorant, shampoo, soap, canned goods, toothbrushes, toothpaste, salvation dolls, toilet paper, school supplies, etc.)

10 pieces of white posterboard cut into fourths

Pieces of colored paper for color coding ministries

Gameboard Spaces – Four Corners, Railroads, Taxes and Utilities (attached)

Setting up the gameboard:

- There are 22 ministries (properties) on the gameboard – 6 sets of three and 2 sets of 2. Each set should be composed of ministries in the same geographical area and designated by the same color. Set a dollar amount for each ministry card.

- Railroads (or other types of transportation you may desire to use) should be referred to as “North, South, East, and West” to denote different areas of the state. You may want to choose ministries from each area that would correspond to the appropriate railroad.
- Utilities (electric company and water) and taxes (luxury and income).
- The four corners
 - “Go/Collect \$200” space
 - “Jail” space – Select a jail ministry from the EBO allocation list to highlight. Set a monetary amount for “bail”.
 - “Go to Jail” space
 - “Free Parking” space
- 3 Chance spaces
- 3 Community Chest spaces
 - Locate designated places for the Community Chest and Chance cards on the gameboard

Tip: You may set up the gameboard as a regulation Monopoly game. For added interest, you may want to set up the gameboard in the shape of Kentucky.

Tip: If space does not allow for a 40-piece gameboard, you may reduce the number of spaces as appropriate.

Playing the Game:

- Each player selects a playing piece and places it on “Go”.
- Each player is given an EB-Opoly Bank card worth \$200. Monies donated or received should be tracked on this card.
- Select a player to begin play.
- The player should throw the dice and move their token in the direction of the arrow the number of spaces indicated by the dice. *Tip: For purposes of this game and in order to cover as many ministries as possible, you may choose to use only one die.*
- When landing on a ministry, the player will make the designated donation for that space. The player would then subtract this amount from their bank card.
- When landing on a utility or tax, the player should make the designated donation and share a way this money could have been used by a ministry. The player would then subtract this amount from their bank card.
- No action is required when landing on a railroad.
- When landing on the four corners:
 - “Go/Collect \$200” – The player adds \$200 to their bank card.
 - “Jail” – The bail money will be given to the designated jail ministry.
 - “Go to Jail” – The player would give an example of a ministry to someone in jail.
 - “Free Parking” – The player hangs out and prays for these ministries until their next turn.

- When landing on “Community Chest” or “Chance” spaces, the player would select the appropriate card and follow the instructions on that card. Again, any monies donated or received should be reflected on the bank card.
- Play continues until a player has successfully donated all of his/her money to the ministries.

Chance Card – Answer Guide

- 1) Eliza Broadus was born and raised in Kentucky.

False – EB was born in Virginia in 1851 but moved with her family to Kentucky in 1877.

- 2) Eliza Broadus was the first Kentucky Vice President to National WMU.

True – National WMU was organized in 1888 and EB was elected VP from Kentucky.

- 3) The state missions offering became known as the Eliza Broadus Offering (EBO) in 1976.

True – In 1913 EB led Kentucky WMU to promote taking an annual offering for state missions in all churches. In 1975 Kentucky WMU voted to name the annual state missions offering in her honor starting in 1976.

- 4) Funds from the EBO only support KY WMU.

False – Funds do support KY WMU but they also support the Kentucky Baptist Convention, Associational Missions and Special Ministries.

- 5) The EBO has never reached \$1 Million.

False – The EBO has collected over \$1 Million.

- 6) The EBO can only be promoted in September.

False – While September is set aside as the time of year to promote state missions and the EBO, your church can choose to promote the offering any time throughout the year.

- 7) The EBO supports KY Baptists by: Equipping to Go, Embracing Brokenness and Advancing the Gospel.

True - Funds from the offering will be used for ministry/evangelism in Kentucky with persons beyond the in-fellowship work of local churches (specifically with those who are not currently members of any church) or for ministries/events which will provide training or support for ministry/evangelism in Kentucky with persons beyond the in-fellowship work of local churches.

- 8) The EBO provides funding for a variety of Kentucky Baptist Ministries.

True – A list of all ministries receiving funding can be found on the KY WMU website (and the book of reports at Annual Meeting).

- 9) The EBO only supports ministries in big cities like Lexington, Louisville and Bowling Green.

False – EBO supports ministries all across the state. Any ministry that is affiliated with KBC Church and endorsed by an Association Missions Strategist or the Associational WMU Director in which the ministry resides can apply for an EBO grant.
