- adopting a KY MSC Missionary
- praying for specific missions needs
- praying for church planters in Kentucky
- learning about the Cooperative Program through a video, lesson, or lunch & learn
- collecting items needed by a local ministry, KY MSC Missionary, or for the WMU's Christmas in August program
- inviting a missionary speaker
- conducting a missions fair
- sponsoring a mission action project or missions trip
- challenging church members to adopt and pray for those going on mission trips through your church
- take your women to the Kentucky WMU Proclaim Missions & Evangelism Conference
- take your men to the Kentucky WMU Men's Missions Rallies
- take your girls in grades 1-6 to GAJAM: Girls missions event
- take your boys in grades 1-6 to RAEXPO: Boys missions campout
- take your teen girls in grades 6-12 to Thrive: Missions Retreat for Teen Girls
