The Journey Begins

Jesus simply healed people:

He healed those who were lame.
He healed those who were blind.
He healed a woman who had been bleeding for twelve years.
He healed a man with a withered hand.
He healed lepers.
He healed paralytics.
He healed invalids, those with fever, and sick.
He even healed those who were DEAD.

"...healing every kind of disease and sickness among the people."

No parlor tricks of a magician or the self-serving, theatrical acts of mythology.



He cast out demons... No incantations, crysta

Jesus simply spoke and the demons departed:

He healed a man who was so possessed that no one could constrain him, not even with chains—a man who hid and lived in the tombs, naked, constantly crying out and cutting himself with stones.

What a horror that must have been, not only for him, but also for the community.

Jesus spoke a few words and he was healed. The man became calm, clothed, and in his right mind.

No incantations, crystals, crazy potions, or sensational theatrics...



He stood before the tomb of His friend Lazarus who had been dead for 4 days...

and again, with no theatrics or sensational actions...

Jesus simply said, "Lazarus, come out."

And a dead, decaying man hobbled out of his grave, still bound in his grave clothes, alive and well again.





He said to the raging storm and sea: "Peace, be still..."

And the winds died and the sea became as glass.

Bold words...

After Jesus finished the Sermon on the Mount, Matthew records that great crowds followed Him. Why?

Because the people were "astonished at His + teaching..." and He was teaching them as "one who had authority" and not as their scribes.

"Whoever hears these WORDS of mine and acts upon them will be like a wise man who built his house upon the rock.... But whoever hears these WORDS of mine and does not act upon them will be like a foolish man who built his house upon the sand." (Matthew 7:24-26)



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But... Many of Jesus's followers began to leave Him because His words were getting too uncomfortable...

Jesus turned to the Twelve and asked them if they wanted to leave as well...

Peter replied, "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life..." (John 6:68)



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When Jesus returned to His home town of Nazareth, Mark records that Jesus was teaching in the synagogue and those who heard Him "were astonished" because of His words and wisdom and mighty works. (Mark 6:2)

But then they began to say, "Wait a second, isn't this Mary's son, the carpenter?"

Then they took "offense at Him."



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Later, Mark records that the chief priests and the scribes were looking to find a way to destroy Jesus because when He went to Jerusalem and began to teach there, the people of Jerusalem were also "astonished at His words". (Mark 11:18)



The people who heard His words were "amazed".

They were "astonished" on the mountain.
They were "astonished" in Capernaum.
They were "astonished" in Jerusalem.



The people who heard His words were "amazed".

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
When the Pharisees and Herodians tried to trap Him... He shut them down with His answers.

When the Sadducees tried to nail Him... His words left them speechless.

When the Pharisees sent their top guy to trip Him up... Jesus turned the tables on him and tripped them all up.

"And no one was able to answer Him a word, nor from that day did anyone dare to ask Him any more questions." (Matthew 22:46)





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- The words of Jesus were powerful in His day... They are still powerful now. +
 - They are still uncomfortable to us.

The words of Jesus were astonishing in His day... They are still astonishing in our day.

The words of Jesus were uncomfortable in His day...



He told us to forgive. He told us to love our enemies. He told us to not be lukewarm. He told us to be light and salt. He told us to do good works. He told us to visit those in prison. He told us to care for the needy. He told us to bear good fruit. **He told us to love our neighbors.**

He told us to forgive others even if they keep hurting us...over and over again. He told us to turn the other cheek when someone strikes us. This is uncomfortable

stuff!

He told us to repent, be holy, to take up our cross and follow Him.



Jesus told us that no matter how good we think we are, we still fall short of God. + He told us we are a murderer if we get angry with someone. +

- He said we are an adulterer if we lust. +
- He said we have to be perfect... +

And we know that we are not...



Peter declared that Jesus had the words of life, but for some, they were words of death...

Jesus was saying to everyone that, without believing in Him, we would remain separated from God, devoid forever of eternal life.

Jesus told Nicodemus that whoever does not believe in Him remains condemned.

Jesus told Martha that anyone who believes in Him will never die.

Jesus told the Pharisees that they were children of the Devil, and that without Him, they would die in their self-righteous sins.

These aren't pretty words.



The Jewish leaders were demanding of Jesus to tell them plainly, "Are you the Messiah?"

> Jesus told them that His works bore witness about Him, but yet they still did not believe.



When Jesus then told them He and the Father "were one," they picked up stones to stone Him...

So, in the end, it was the words that brought the greatest opposition.

Then Jesus said: "I have shown you many good works from the Father; for which of them are you going to stone me?"

The Jews answered Him: "It is not for a good work that we are going to stone you, but for blasphemy, because you,

calling the Pharisees, scribes and teachers of the Law "hypocrites," "vipers," and "white-washed tombs full of dead men's bones."




Jesus was unafraid to speak the truth! He was bold and courageous, yet humble, gracious, and kind.
